Program Description

Head Start is based on the premise that all children share certain needs, and children from low-income families, in particular, benefit from a comprehensive child development program designed to meet those needs. Head Start is family-oriented, comprehensive and community-based, offering support for parents in their work and child-rearing roles, as well as linkages to other community social services.

AKA Head Start/Early Head Start is staffed with approximately 231 full-time employees, with locations at 14 centers throughout the East County of San Diego. Program options include center based and home-based (services offered at the family's home).

Head Start for Pre-schoolers

Head Start provides comprehensive services for children ages 3 to 5, and their families. Head Start encourages the role of parents as their child's first and most important teachers. Programs build relationships with families that support positive parent-child relationships, family well-being, and connections to peers and community. Services include:

- Promoting school readiness of young children
 Developmental and Behavioral Screenings
- Health and Nutrition services;
 Social Services

Early Head Start for Infant/Toddlers

The Early Head Start program (adopted in July 2013) was established to assist infants and toddlers to age 3. The goals of Early Head Start are:

- To provide safe and developmentally enriching caregiving, which promotes the physical, cognitive, social and emotional development of infants and toddlers, and prepares them for future growth and development;
- To support parents in their role as primary caregivers and teachers of their children, and families in meeting personal goals and achieving self sufficiency across a wide variety of domains;
- To mobilize communities to provide the resources and environment necessary to ensure a comprehensive, integrated array of services and support for families.

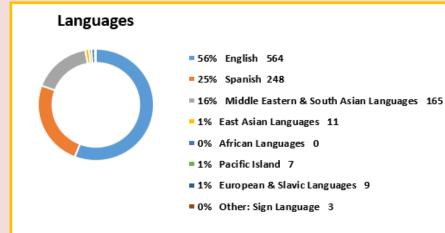

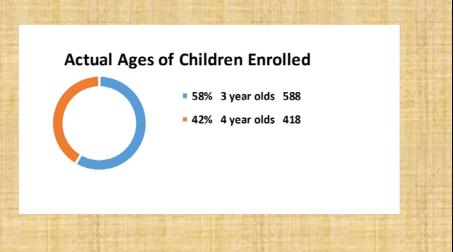

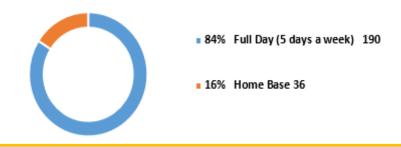

EARLY HEAD START ENROLLMENT

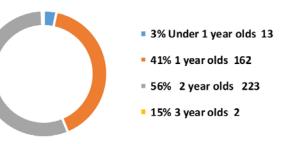
AKA Early Head Start was funded for 226 infants/toddlers, serving a cumulative total of 400 children and 380 families. The funded enrollment represents a service level of less than 2% of the eligible children in San Diego East County.

AKA Early Head Start children maintained 100% Average Monthly Enrollment. The graph below depicts the Early Head Start funded enrollment by option.

FINANCIAL & PROGRAM AUDIT INFORMATION

2018-2019 Actual Revenue by Funding Source \$14,496,796



From February 4 to February 8, 2019, the Administration for Children and Families conducted a Focus Area 1 Monitoring Audit. A review of the agency's approach to staffing structure, program design, education, health services, family services, fiscal infrastructure, and program governance was reviewed. All Kids Academy Head Start had no findings. The agency's financial audit for the year ending in June 2019 resulted in no compliance findings. Leases include rent payments to building landlords. "Other" includes office, classroom, computer, janitorial, and maintenance supplies, staff training, family services and liability insurance.

SCHOOL READINESS AND CHILD OUTCOMES

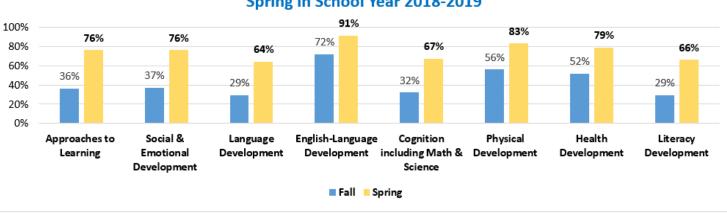
AKA Head Start uses scientific, research-based curricula for environmental classroom set-up, use, and strategies. Our children are taught through the use of Creative Curriculum. Using the Creative Curriculum, teaching staff implement activities to support children's development and ensures both Early Head Start and Head Start children are school ready.

AKA Head Start tracks each child's development within the Five Essential Domains of development; cognitive, language and literacy, approaches to learning, social-emotional, and physical.

The education staff, in partnership with parents, set age and skill appropriate goals for the children, using an observation-based assessment tool (DRDP-2015). The DRDP-2015 is a developmental continuum and is used to assess both Early Head Start and Head Start children. The assessment is completed three times a year to measure child outcomes success to ensure children leave the program ready for school.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- CLASS[®] is a valid and reliable research-based observation instrument that assesses classroom quality, including multiple dimensions of teacher-child interactions linked to positive child outcomes and later achievement. The agency maintains an above national average CLASS Score which increased over 1% from the prior year.
- All Kid's Academy classrooms are rated by an outside source using the nationally recognized tool, Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale[®] (ECERS). Scores were above average reflecting healthy and safe learning environments which build positive relationships and opportunities for stimulation and learning from experience.
- 98% of all teaching staff have a valid California Teacher Permit; 59% have a baccalaureate degree or higher.
- Electronic advances have been brought into the classroom as supports for our teaching staff. This program year each teacher had access to My Teachstone[®] which provides a menu of strategies for teachers to use in the classroom.
- Recognizing a large population of grandparents raising their grandchildren in the program, a Grandparents and Relatives Raising Children support group was developed. The mission is to support and inspire grandparents and relatives raising children in a trusting, safe environment to become advocates and leaders who can make connections to peers and community, that support themselves and their family. Childcare was provided while attendees had presentations on requested topics such as self-care, wellness and coping with stress, guardianship, and nutrition. A recognized appreciation has been the opportunity to network and connect with other kinship families.
- The 2019 Parent Summit provided workshops on immigration information, kindergarten readiness, employment readiness, nutrition, positive discipline, and supporting your home language. The event was attended by over 200 parents and their children with the overall theme of 'Alone we are unique, Together we are a Masterpiece!'
